Family Health Services


Public Health Nurses (PHNs) work with families in the home and in the community.

What is a Public Health Nurse (PHN)?

A Public Health Nurse (PHN) is a Registered Nurse with a Certification in Public Health.

Public Health Nurses blend the knowledge of nursing with that of public health and social services

They are skilled in working with high-risk families and diverse cultures.

PHN home visits to families are provided at no cost.

What do Public Health Nurses do?

- Assess the family as a whole for needs, strengths, and resources
- Attend to the specific health needs of family members
- Provide health screening and physical assessment
- Assist in locating appropriate community resources
- Educate individuals and groups about health topics
- Coordinate services
- Support family health and self-sufficiency
- Provide visits to families in their home or other community location
- Listen and not judge

What can Public Health Nurses help with?

- Overall health and other concerns
- Pregnancy
- Postpartum recovery and breast-feeding
- New baby care and bonding, attachment
- Children's health, growth, and development concerns
- Parent's health concerns
- Parenting support and education
- Home safety
- Support for families with domestic violence or communication problems
- Finding medical insurance or health care
- Finding resources
