I spoke to someone from the city and directed him to a publication (ATF P 5310.1) that describes the school zone provision. Basically a person cannot possess a firearm within 1,000 feet of the grounds of a school (school zone) unless they are on private property such as a business premise of an FFL. If your customers leave your establishment, are no longer considered on private property, and they are within the 1,000 feet, then their firearms will have to unloaded and in a locked container or a locked firearms rack in a vehicle.

Dear Jeff,

I met with the city planning commission this week. Their notes from our meeting are attached.

I think everything went well, but I still need to wait until July 23rd for the City Council to grant the final approval.

Regarding the school zone, some members of the planning commission are concerned that my retail location is located in a school zone. When you and I met at my proposed location, I indicated to you that a private school was located on the adjacent property. You informed me that since the school is not located in the mall premises, my retail shop is not considered to be in a school zone and we checked "not applicable" for section 11 of the Acknowledgement form. I explained to the planning commission what you told me during our meeting, but they still seemed concerned.

I just want to make sure that my shop is not considered to be in a school zone, according to the ATF's definition of a school zone. I am trying to provide as much supporting information to the city as possible. And in case my retail shop is considered to be in a school zone, how can we proceed to provide the city with the correct information?

Again, I really appreciate your help with my application.
